Minnesota Sheltie Rescue Adoption Application

For the safety and well-being of the rescue Sheltie, and to determine the best match between Sheltie and family, anyone interested in adopting a sheltie from MNSR must fill out an application and be approved for adoption. The approval process includes this application, references and a home visit. We greatly appreciate your patience, as we are an all-volunteer organization. For optimal rehabilitation, all of our Shelties are fostered in private homes and we do not operate a shelter. Meetings with available Shelties are arranged once an applicant is approved for adoption.

Adoption fees are set based on the dog's age:

Under 4 years \$450 4-8 years \$350 9 years & up \$250

The cost of veterinary care exceeds the adoption fee in most cases. Donations in addition to the adoption fee are welcome and much appreciated.

Minnesota Sheltie Rescue requires that any dog adopted from us must be returned to us in the event the owner is unable to care for the dog.

All animals placed by MNSR are spayed or neutered prior to placement. Responsible pet owners spay/neuter their pets.

Many of the shelties needing new homes may not be comfortable with, or suitable for, young children. Therefore, we rarely have shelties available that would be a good match to families with children under 8-10 years old. If that is your case, you are welcome to submit an adoption application, and we will keep it on file in the event that a compatible dog comes in. We can also provide resources on locating a reputable Sheltie breeder.

We reserve the right to refuse any application as well as the right not to explain our reasons for doing so. We will only consider a distance placement for certain dogs, at our discretion, and such placements generally require unique circumstances. Additional requirements apply. Applicants should apply to Sheltie rescues closest to where they live when possible. Preference is given to families within one day roundtrip driving of Minneapolis or Fargo.

Shelties are a high flight risk breed. They are very difficult to find and catch once they are lost. Most of the rescue Shelties need a <u>physical wood or chain link fence</u> for their safety and well-being. Due to flight risk, an invisible fence or "e-fence" will not contain many Shelties nor protect them from outside harm, and in general, a home with an invisible fence will be considered the same as a home with no fence. We occasionally adopt to homes without a physical fence when we have a suitable match, but please be aware that there will be a longer wait for meeting a Sheltie, and we require the adopter to use a leash or lead at all times for the lifetime of the Sheltie wherever a physical chain or wood fence does not exist. Priority is given to homes that have a secure physical fence.

Please note that we cannot guarantee the availability of the Shelties in our program, and that our priority is to meet the needs of the Shelties in our care.

Please note that a home visit/tour is part of the approval process. If you live outside the Twin Cities metro area, it may take us longer to arrange for your home visit. If approved, you will be required to drive to the foster home to meet MNSR Shelties. Most Shelties are fostered in the Twin Cities, or the bio will indicate the Sheltie's location if fostered outside of the Twin Cities. Only certain Shelties will be considered for distance adoptions, at our discreticand only in special circumstances. Applicants should apply to Sheltie rescues closest to where they live when possible we reserve the right to refuse any application, as well as our right not to explain our reason(s) for doing so.
